Reason for full school opening	The Science	All	High	Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The prevalence of Coronavirus (COVID-19) has decreased • The NHS Test and Trace system is up and running • The risk to children themselves of becoming severely ill from Coronavirus (COVID-19) is very low and there are negative health impacts of being out of school. • The Office of National Statistics analysis on Coronavirus (COVID-19) related deaths linked to occupations suggest that staff in educational settings tend not to be at any greater risk from the disease than many other occupations • There is no evidence that children transmit the disease any more than adults • Given the improved position, the balance of risk is now overwhelmingly in favour of children returning to school.

Travelling to/from School by home-school transport		Students	High	Medium	Students must obey any social distancing and close contact measures implemented by the transport company; students must not board home-school transport if if they, or a member of their household, has symptoms of Coronavirus (COVID-9); it is recommended that students wear a face covering; advice for passengers on public transport to adopt a social distance of two metres from people outside their household or support bubble, or a 'one metre plus' approach where this is not possible, will not apply from the autumn term on dedicated transport; ensure adequate ventilation of fresh air; touch as few surfaces as possible; avoid loud talking, shouting, singing; hand sanitiser should be used on boarding and alighting.

However, all staff will be supplied with a PPE kit containing: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plastic face visor • Large bottle of hand sanitiser • Antiviral spray • Disposable cloths • Disposable gloves Should staff also wish to wear a face mask they may do so but should provide their own mask. Full PPE is provided for first aid/welfare aid purposes only.

Upon arrival at School		All	High	Low	The wearing of face coverings is at the discretion of the Head teacher; students and staff should wear a face covering when entering the buildings, unless exempt, adopting the slogan 'Stand Up, Masks On (SUMO)'; face coverings should only be removed once inside a classroom; used PPE and any disposable face coverings that staff or students arrive wearing should be placed in a refuse bag or lined bin and can be disposed of as normal domestic waste; persons must be instructed not to touch the front of their face covering during use of face coverings or when removing them; should staff and/or students wish to wear face masks and/or gloves throughout the day they may do so but if discarded during the day they must be disposed of correctly; any non-disposable face coverings that staff or students are wearing when they arrive must be removed by the wearer and placed into a plastic bag that the wearer has brought with them in order to take it home; the wearer must then clean their hands as detailed in 'Washing hands'.

Presenting the curriculum - continued	Controlling the transmission rate of Coronavirus (COVID-19)	Staff	High	Low	Resources shared between groups, such as sports, art, D&T and science equipment, should be cleaned frequently and meticulously by the department technicians and always between groups, or rotated to allow them to be left unused and out of reach for a period of 48 hours (72 hours for plastics); technicians to be supplied with cleaning resources; limit the amount of shared resources that are taken home and limit exchange of take-home resources between staff and students whenever possible; try to avoid working with paper/other materials that are shared in a way that may aid transmission; prevent the sharing of stationery and other equipment whenever possible; shared materials and surfaces should be cleaned and disinfected more frequently and between different group use whenever possible; keyboard, mouse, whiteboard, projector remotes etc to be cleaned with sanitising wipes between users; staff to have a personal supply of hand sanitiser, anti-viral spray, wipes and disposable gloves; staff to use own board markers and rubbers; Learning Hub can be booked for group use but subject to the year group daily rotations; iPads only available by advanced booking in order to facilitate cleaning and sanitising; computer rooms only available for timetabled and pre-booked lessons with keyboards and mice being cleaned and sanitised before and after use. Students should limit the amount of equipment they bring into school each day to a minimum; students to bring their own stationery equipment and not share; any stationery items given to students should not be returned; students to be sat side by side and facing forwards rather than face to face or side on, whenever possible; Learning Hub available to one year group only on a daily rotation; books cannot be issued to students.
